# **DO WE NEED A NEW BASEBALL STADIUM?**

Proponents say a new stadium is the only way to bring baseball back to DC. They argue it will ignite development, create jobs and subsidize needed social services in Southwest. Opponents say it's a bad financial deal for DC, should not come ahead of needed school and health investments, and will force out long-time residents through gentrification. Is there an alternative? A middle ground? What do you think?

## **Speakers:**

For starters, we plan to have the Mayor's Office present the plan for the Stadium and give the arguments in favor. Ed Lezere of the DC Policy Research Institute, will give the economic arguments against the Stadium. Marge Micuda, President of the Southwest Neighborhood Assembly will convey the attitudes of the district most impacted by the proposed Stadium and tell us a little about her organization. As always, there will be plenty of opportunity to ask questions or raise issues.
