**DC's NEW COMPREHENSIVE PLAN:  
What will it mean for you and for the City?**

DC's Home Rule law calls for a new Comprehensive Plan for the city--rethinking land use policies that will impact our city's growth for the next twenty years. The Plan and its accompanying maps will guide revisions of outdated zoning and reach into every neighborhood. It will affect our parks, open space, transportation, schools and more. The Office of Planning's first draft was quickly followed by a revised "Mayor's Plan" in July, with very little time for public input. The Mayor would like it approved before he leaves office and the City Council is about to hold its first hearing. But some ask: Why the rush? Shouldn't citizens have a chance to digest and react to this vital 500-page document? Why should this long-range Plan be set in stone before we elect a new Administration and Council? Others believe it is essential to create an independent Planning Commission to administer the Plan. Panelists at this meeting will provide an overview of the Plan and discuss its strengths and weaknesses.
